Outdoor Recreation

- 1 SENECA ROCKS**
Seneca Rocks, located in the Monongahela National Forest, is one of the most photographed landmarks in West Virginia. The magnificent formation, which rises nearly 900 feet above the North Fork River, is popular with rock climbers and a longtime scenic attraction in the state.
- 2 NORTH FORK MOUNTAIN TRAIL**
The North Fork Mountain Trail, which is approximately 24 miles long, is ideal for a 2 to 3-day backpacking trip that is full of wildlife and amazing scenery.
- 3 MONONGAHELA NATIONAL FOREST**
The Monongahela National Forest is an expansive 921,000 acres in the east-central part of West Virginia. The national forest has more than 800 miles of trails, with nearly 20 designated hiking trails at Spruce Knob alone.
- 4 NROCKS OUTDOOR ADVENTURE**

The Via Ferrata at NROCKS is a one-of-a-kind adventure, offering a mile of fixed-anchor, professionally-guided rock climbing. NROCKS also offers the North Fork Valley Canopy Tour, which includes 12 ziplines, 3 swinging bridges, and a 40 foot rappel.
- 5 SMOKE HOLE CANYON**
Smoke Hole Canyon is a hidden gem for outdoor enthusiasts. Carved by the South Branch of the Potomac River, you can access the North Fork Mountain Trail, climbing routes, paddling, and biking adventures.
- 6 REED'S CREEK**
Small sport climbing area located between Franklin and Petersburg with limestone cliffs very similar to Franklin Gorge, but with more moderate climbs.

- 7 SENECA CAVERNS**

- 8 HIGHLANDS GOLF CLUB AT FISHER MOUNTAIN**

The 18-hole "The Highlands" course at the The Highlands Golf Club At Fisher Mountain facility in Franklin, West Virginia features 6,796 yards of golf from the longest tees for a par of 71.
- 9 BRANDYWINE RECREATION AREA**

Located on the 10-acre Brandywine Lake, this wooded recreation area affords access to multiple hiking and mountain biking trails, a swimming beach, and a campground.
- 10 SENECA CREEK FALLS**
Located in the Monongahela National Forest on Spruce Knob, Seneca Creek Falls is one of Pendleton County's secluded spots. Hidden at the base of the highest point in WV, this waterfall is a nature lover's dream. The cool water and large rocks make it a picturesque location.
- 11 RUDDLE PARK**
7864 Petersburg Pike
Upper Tract
Local park with a walking path around the exterior. There are also baseball diamonds, playground equipment, and shaded picnic areas.
- 12 TOWN PARK**
North High Street
Franklin
Situated nearby to the swimming pool with pavilions available to rent.

- 13 THORN SPRING PARK**

Open to the public with cabins for rent, full hookups for trailers and RVs, campsites, and large playing fields. Host to 4-H camp for one week of the year.
- 14 YOKUM'S STABLES**

Epic Views

- 18 SPRUCE KNOB**
At 4,863 feet above sea level, Spruce Knob is West Virginia's highest peak. This area offers backpacking and day hiking opportunities for visitors. Spruce Knob Tower, a stone and steel observation tower, sits atop the Knob and provides visitors with a vantage point from which to enjoy a breathtaking view.
- 20 REDDISH KNOB**
Reddish Knob, located on the Virginia/West Virginia state line west of Harrisonburg, is a popular local spot with spectacular vistas. You can take a long, difficult hike to the top or drive the paved road to the top.
- 21 GERMAN VALLEY OVERLOOK**
Situating in northeast Pendleton County, German Valley is one of the most picturesque locations in the state. Known for its extensive cave system, with dozens of caves documented, it was designated a National Natural Landmark in 1973 by the National Park Service. This 10-mile-long valley is named for the German families who first settled here.

- 18 TREASURE MOUNTAIN FLEA MARKET**
200 Confederate Road, Franklin
Open Saturdays, May–September.

Historic Sites

- 22 CIVIL WAR TRAILS**
800 men of Pendleton County gave their services to the Confederacy and another 300 remained loyal to the Union. Pendleton County was truly "Twixt North and South."
- 23 BOGGS MUSEUM**
Oak Street, Franklin
The oldest house in Pendleton County. Built from logs in 1758, it was originally located three miles north of Franklin and used as a frontier fort.
- 24 MCCOY HOUSE**
Main Street, Franklin
During the Civil War in May 1862, the McCoy House was used as a communications center for the Union Army.
- 25 FORT SEYBERT**
Destroyed by Delaware Indians in April 1758, it was then rebuilt by the VA colonial militia in 1758 as a larger stockade with four blockhouses, known as Fort Seybert. Fort Seybert is an unincorporated community located in Pendleton County.
- 26 ANANIAS PITSENBARGER HOMESTEAD**
3576 Dry Run Road, Franklin
A 130-acre historic log homestead built in 1845, with 15 log and frame outbuildings. Locally known as "Loafer's Glory" because of the Pitsenbarger's hospitality, it is also the location of Dry Run Spirits distillery. Walking tours offered daily.

A production microbrewery and taproom located in the heart of Appalachia.



Regional Attractions

- 31 DOLLY SODS**
The 17,371-acre Dolly Sods Wilderness in the Monongahela National Forest is part of the National Wilderness Preservation System. The Dolly Sods Wilderness contains much of the Red Creek drainage and contains bog and heath eco-types, more commonly found in southern Canada. Elevations range from 2,500 to over 4,700 feet.
- 32 SMOLE HOLE CAVERNS**

Deep beneath the scenic beauty of West Virginia, the Smoke Hole Caverns provide visitors with a glimpse of the scenery below the surface. The bizarre-looking formations of minerals look like a scene from a lost world of an old science fiction movie. Tours through the caverns take a little less than an hour.

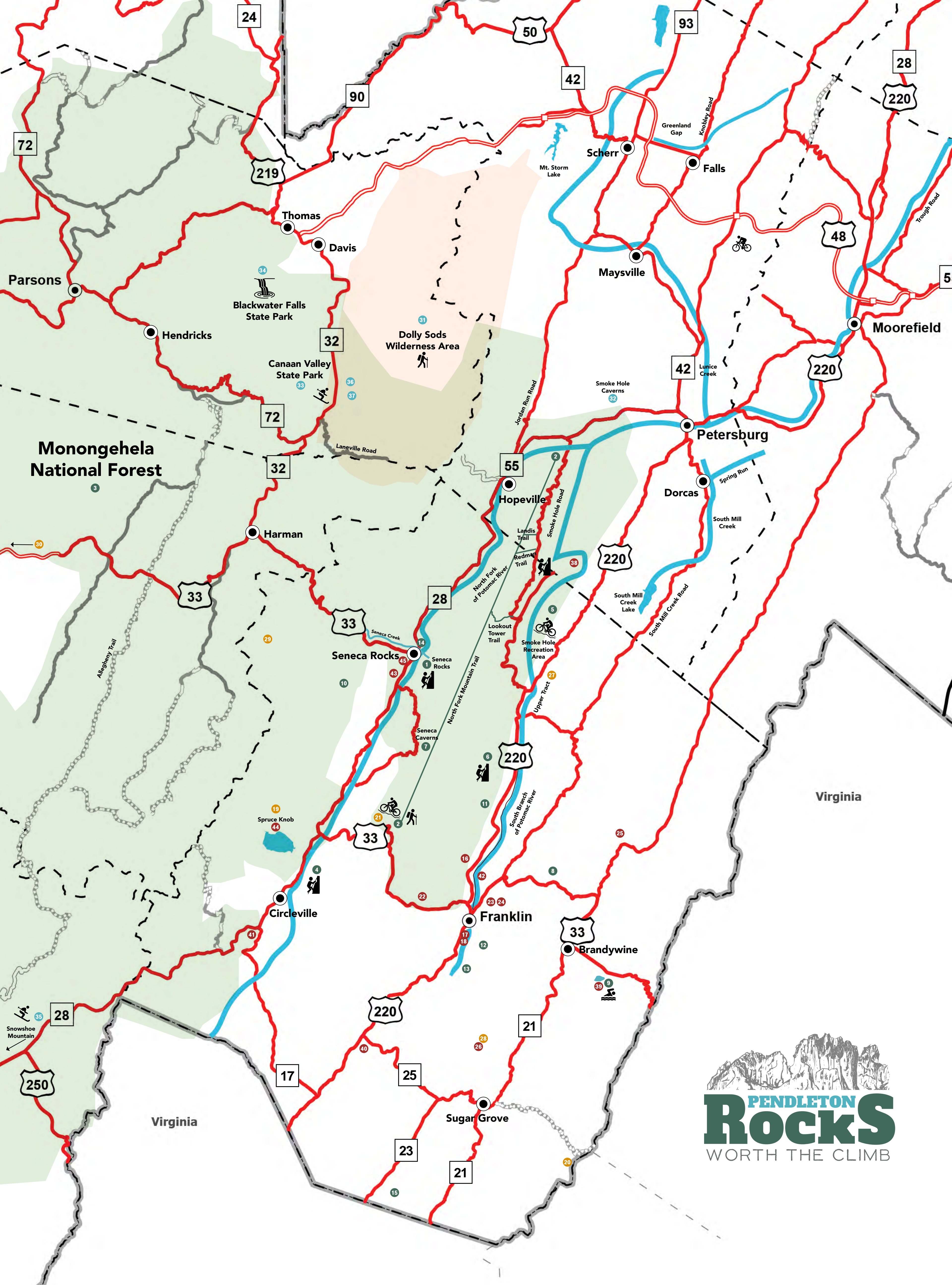
